The JCBRA was established in 1998 under the Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act 381 of 1996, as amended. The JCBRA assists participating municipalities and developers through the use of tax increment financing, grants, loans, and other incentives.

The JCBRA is a volunteer board, and is staffed and served by The Enterprise Group of Jackson, Inc. The Board works to bring quality jobs and new investments to the county.

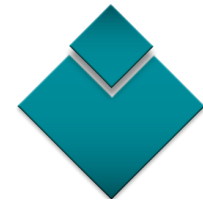

Resources

- U.S. EPA grants totaling \$400,000. which can be used to assess the environmental condition of sites suspected of being impacted by petroleum products or hazardous substances.
- Ability to Pursue State and Federal Grants and Loans
- Local Site Remediation Revolving Fund
- Brownfield Tax Increment Financing (TIF), which provides a method of financing environmental response activities necessary to redevelop contaminated properties. Brownfield TIFs can be used to pay for a variety of eligible costs, including the costs associated with BEAs, Due Care Plans and additional response activities.

Eligible Activities

Grant-Funded:

- Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments
- Baseline Environmental Assessments
- Due Care Plans
- Brownfield Plans
- Cleanup Planning

Tax Capture Reimbursement:

- Demolition, Lead, Mold, and Asbestos Abatements
- Cleanup Activities
- Includes above Grant-funded Activities



A Brownfield site is real property where expansion, redevelopment or reuse may be complicated by the presence - or potential presence - of a hazardous



Project Steps

Contact JCBRA Staff for a Funding Request Application —also available on the web site. Note: Applicant cannot be a liable party.



Submit the completed, signed application to JCBRA Staff.

JCBRA Staff and Environmental Consultant will then:

Determine site eligibility for grant funding

Contact local unit of government

Refer applications to JCBRA Board for consideration

Consider potential reimbursement and/or development agreements with applicant

Arrange approvals/hearings necessary for Brownfield Plans and Cleanup Plans

Schedule grant-funded activities conducted by County-contracted environmental consultant
