

RE: Building Communities through Brownfield Redevelopment:

Jackson County, the Jackson County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority and The Enterprise Group are pleased to be able to participate in helping your project move forward. The work of the Jackson County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority is funded largely by our access to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Brownfield Assessment Grants and other resources. Access to these funds is highly competitive, and we are able to secure these dollars based on our ability to continually demonstrate an effective use of funds to restore properties to productive use and positively impact local economic and community conditions.

As good stewards of the funds, it is important for us to help demonstrate how every project helps us promote EPA's objectives. The EPA's Brownfields Assessment Program is being carried out consistent with the principles of the Partnership for Sustainable Communities (PSC) established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), and the EPA. The PSC was conceived to advance development patterns and infrastructure investment programs that achieve improved economic prosperity, and healthy, environmentally sustainable, and opportunity-rich communities for all Americans, regardless of race or income.

One way we have chosen to implement these principles is to ask those businesses that we support to consider ways they can have a positive effect on the neighborhood in which their brownfield project is located. Such an effort positively impacts the lives of those that have been most affected by a Brownfield site. Examples include:

- Targeting local residents for future job opportunities
- Providing public infrastructure improvements that benefit both the business and community
- Enhancing public transportation access to your site and neighborhood
- Improving nearby residents' access to greenspace and recreational properties, schools, public transit, etc.
- Or considering other projects that promote sustainable and equitable development.

These goals can be met by enhancing your existing project to include features that encompass these principles, and by working with existing organizations in the neighborhood that help advance these values. To help you know where you can start, we have prepared a list of organizations that work both at the neighborhood level and throughout the community. They stand ready to help you know where a small effort on your part can positively impact the neighborhood that has been impacted by Brownfield sites.

We encourage you to find ways that have a positive impact both on your business and your local neighborhood. Perhaps now is not the best time as you are undoubtedly preoccupied with the many details of your existing project – but please consider the energy and efforts of others in your organization that may be able and willing to advance such an effort. We hope that you will report back to us on any and all efforts your organization has been able to undertake. This helps us demonstrate the benefit of our public support for your project and compete for additional funds in the future.
